

SCHOOL ROUTINES & TIMINGS

From Monday 6th September, please follow the following steps:

All children will have a 1 hour lunch break every day.

COVID-19

Please remember to phone the school office (0208 902 5454) if your child displays any of the 3 covid-19 symptoms (high temperature, new continuous cough or loss or change to sense of taste or smell). DO NOT send your child to school. If you are unsure about isolation or quarantine rules, please phone the school office, who will then provide you with the correct guidance.

PARENT PAY

Thank you to those of you who choose to use Parent Pay as a means of paying dinner money. Parents and carers of children in Year 3 have been provided with information about activating your account.

For those of you who prefer to pay by cash, please do so by posting the money in an envelope clearly labelled with your child's full name and class into the box outside the school office.

PUPIL DETAILS

Thank you to those of you who have updated us with new contact or address details.

In line with our safeguarding policy and in order for us to be able to contact you in the case of any emergencies, it is important that we have the correct contact details.

We will be providing you with details we hold of your child in the next couple of weeks; should you notice any incorrect information, please inform the office so that they can be updated on our system.

This also includes any medical conditions; please ensure that the Welfare Team has any inhalers, epi-pens, etc that will need to be used.

READING

Reading is a huge school priority; it was so nice hearing about children talking excitedly about reading, sharing their quiz scores with each other and reading a wider range of books. It is important that this continues this year.

Next week, children will be given a reading log and reading folder to take home. They will have a reading and library book to borrow, which must be brought to school every day.

It is important that the children take care of these belongings and if they are lost or damaged, we will be asking for parents/carers to pay for a replacement. Reading folders are 50p, reading logs are £1.50 and for any books lost or damaged the full cost of the book will be expected to be paid.
