THE EYFS AREAS OF LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT

There are seven areas of learning and development that shape educational programmes in early years settings. All areas of learning and development are important and inter-connected.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

- The curriculum covers the seven areas of learning and development with a strong focus on the prime areas
- Daily carpet sessions
- Children learn from practical and play based experiences in meaningful contexts
- A balance of adult led and child initiated activities







HEALTH

- Please inform your child's key person and the school office of all medical needs including allergies.
- All children who require an inhaler for asthma or an EpiPen for allergies must have these in school before they can start.
- If your child needs glasses to see, they must wear them to school every day.
- Children are provided with a piece of fruit and carton of milk every day.
- Every child will need to bring a bottle of water.

TOILET TRAINING



- By age 3, 9 out of 10 children are dry most days
- If you haven't started toilet training your child, please start now
- Children should be able to use the toilet independently
- Teach your child how to wash their hands too!

UNIFORM

Children are expected to wear:

- A white polo shirt
- Navy or black jogging bottoms
- A school sweatshirt
- White or black socks
- Black school shoes











Jewellery must not be worn. Studs can be worn in pierced ears.

Each child must bring a spare set of clothes in a draw-string bag. These will be left at nursery. Please ensure all clothing and shoes are marked with your child's name.

OUTDOOR CLOTHING

Children have access to outdoor learning in all weathers. Please ensure that your child wears a waterproof coat on wet days. Please help your child to learn how to put on their coat on independently.

Children will also need a pair of wellington boots and spare set of socks to wear during wet weather. These can be kept at school.

BOOK BAG

All children will need a school book bag to take books, letters and learning home. Please ensure any books lent to your child are returned in the same condition that they were given. Lost or damaged books will be charged.





HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD TO GET READY TO START NURSERY

- Sing and read to your child
- Talk to your child and encourage them to speak using sentences
- Make opportunities for your child to play with other children
- Teach them to become more independent e.g. getting dressed and managing personal belongings and hygiene
- Play and draw with your child
- Teach your child how to use the toilet independently

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

We want to make sure that we are providing your child with the best education and support we can. Healthy school food has obvious health benefits and can help pupils establish healthy habits for life. Healthy school food can also help to improve pupils' readiness to learn.

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- . Universal Credit with an annual household net earned income of no more than £7,400
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance . Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- . The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
 Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Children who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right are also allowed to receive free school meals.

 Children under the compulsory school age who are in full time education may also be entitled to receive

Registering for free meals could also raise an extra £1,345 for your child's primary school and £955 for your child's secondary school, to fund valuable support like extra £1,tion, additional teaching staff or after school activities. This additional money, known as Pupil Premium, is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above.

If you receive benefits please apply using this form to ensure that your child's school receives this important extra funding - even if you don't want your child to receive a free meal.

You must complete all sections of the application form, including all details of each child attending a school in Brent and sign the declaration statement. We may contact you if any more information is

Please note: For children in schools not in Brant you will have to apply to the borough that maintains the school. Eligibility for free school meals will not be backdated.

How to apply for Free School Meals

How to create an account for Free School Meals

Before starting you will need:

- Your Full name
- Full address including postcode
- An email address
- A contact number
- . Your National Insurance (NI) or National Asylum Support Service (NASS) number
- For the children that you are applying you will also need their full names, DOB and address if it is different from yours.
- 1. Log onto: www.brent.gov.uk
- 2. Search Free school meals in the search bar
- 3. Scroll down and you will see Apply for School Meals
- 4. Click on Online application to create a username and password
- 5. You will receive a link into your email address it will be from children@brent.gov.uk
- 6. Go into your emails and click on the link sent.
- 7. Your username will be your email address and password that you created for the account.
- 8. Enter your email and password. It will take you to the site directly.
- 9. Now click on add children:
- 10. You will need to add your child/ren's full name, date of birth, gender and the school that the child attends. IF YOUR CHILD DOES NOT GO TO A BRENT

SCHOOL DO NOT COMPLETE THE FORM FOR THEM.

- 11. You can add 6 children on one form by clicking on Add Child.
- 12. After you have entered the information about your child/ren, then press
- 13. You will go to another page. Here you will need to add your National Insurance (NI) number or National Asylum Support Service (NASS) and date
- 14. Tick the declaration and press send. You will be contacted when your application is received and the school can check to see if you are eligible.

THINGS TO DO BEFORE YOUR CHILD STARTS

- Return all admissions forms to the school office by Monday 16th June.
- Attend the key person meeting and Stay and Play session in September
- Check your child's start date and time
- Read all the information sent in the induction pack
